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Answer

By default, Thunderbird 2.0 will forward messages as an attachment instead of inline in the message. The attachment type it forwards is blocked as an executable file on the MIT mail servers. To prevent this from happening, you can try to do the following:

Windows

Navigate to **Thunderbird > Go to Tools > Options > Composing > Change Forward Message from As Attachment to Inline**

OS X

Thunderbird > Preferences > Composition > General > Change Forward Message from As Attachment to Inline
