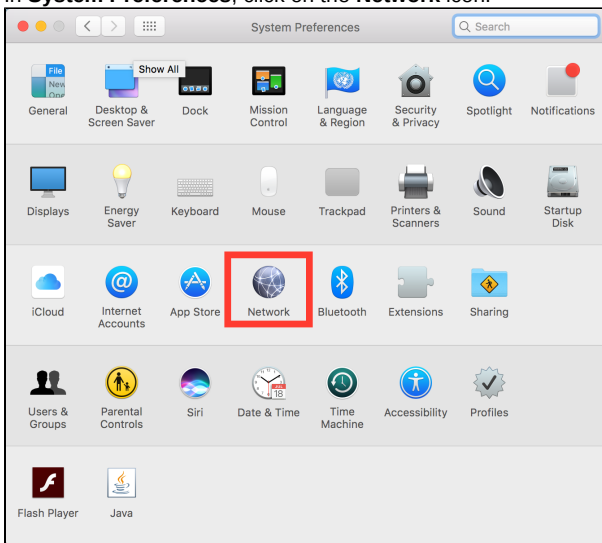


macOS - How do I find my IP address

1.  **Finder** File Edit View Go Window Help
2. Select **System Preferences**.
3. In **System Preferences**, click on the **Network** icon.



4. In the **Network** preference pane select from the list of the left:
