Q: Certificate Not Valid Error - Certificate Test Fails

Context

- Running Avast anti-virus/security software
- Obtained certificate manually or with Certaid with no error messages/obvious issues
- · Certificate Test fails
- · Certificate not valid error

Avast software (provided by some vendors with new hardware as well as for stand-alone purchase) can cause MIT Certificates to silently fail when being installed due to how Avast secures your local keychain (identity data storage) information.

Solution

- 1. Turn off or uninstall Avast.
- 2. Obtain certificates. IS&T strongly recommends using Certaid.
- 3. Install Sophos Anti-Virus or turn back on Avast to protect your computer.
