Context

Recycling electronics prevents valuable [and hazardous] materials from going into the waste stream. Consumers now have many options to recycle or donate for reuse their used electronics. Many computer, TV, and cell phone manufacturers, as well as electronics retailers offer some kind of take back program or sponsor recycling events. from EPA eCycling

MIT e-Waste can be recycled through Facilities, but personal equipment should be recycled through the numerous offerings available through cities, manufactures and retailers. See How Do I Get Rid of My Old Computer Equipment? for more details on recycling MIT equipment.

Answer

Depending on where you live, your city or town may provide free electronic waste recycling. Check with your municipality's DPW for more details. Here are some local towns that offer some forms of e-Waste Recycling.
