

# Accessing the CITI Site for the First Time

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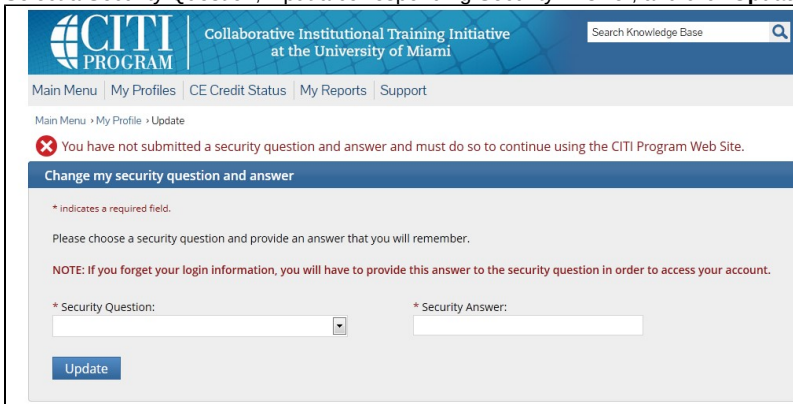
MIT utilizes the CITI program for training on: Ethical Use of Human Subjects in Research, Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR) and Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC – known at MIT as the CAC (Committee on Animal Care)).

- You must log into training through MIT's website to ensure that you are properly associated with MIT and your training records are transferred.
- You will need an MIT personal certificate for authentication.
- Enter your MIT ID into the "CITI InstPersonID" so that completions will transfer.

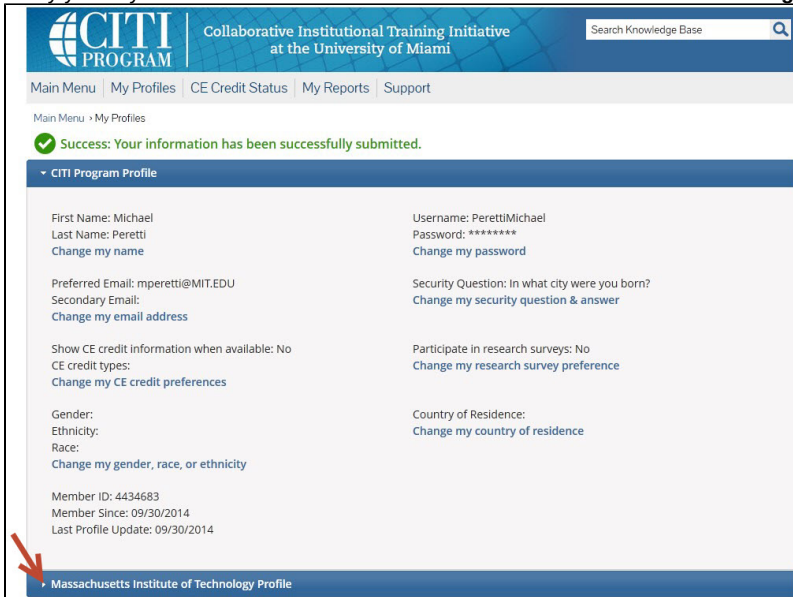
