

Changing Your Site Logo in Drupal

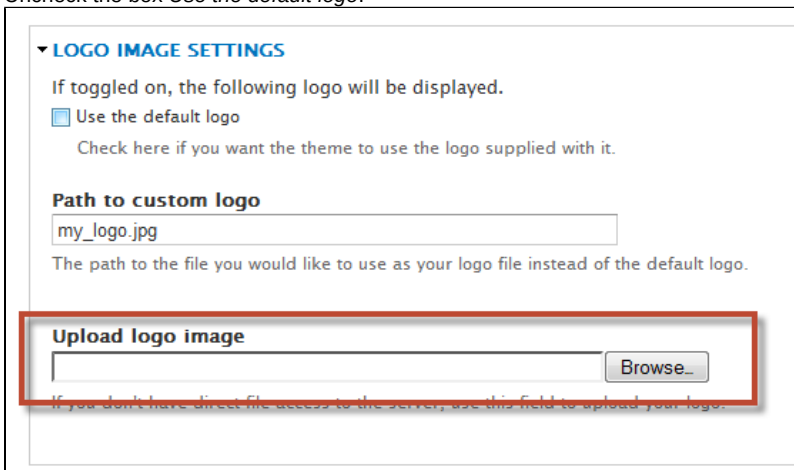
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Using Your Own Logo

1. Click **Appearance**, then **Settings**.
2. Scroll way down on the page and click **LOGO IMAGE SETTINGS**.
3. Click **Browse** and locate the logo image on your computer.
4. Select the image and click **Open**.
5. Click *Save configuration*.

Removing the Default Logo

1. Click **Appearance**, then **Settings**.
2. Scroll down and open the section for **LOGO IMAGE SETTINGS**.
3. Uncheck the box *Use the default logo*.
